

God's Love for us

Canon Tom Gunning

As the London train approached Bath Spa Station you could see the words "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son" on the roof of the Baptist church. This quotation from St John's Gospel is well known and the preceding verses in today's Gospel passage explain how God loved the world. Jesus says "The Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert" (Jn 3:14). Jesus is referring to his Crucifixion and comparing it to the holding up of a fiery bronze serpent. Jesus' death brings salvation just as all who gazed on the fiery serpent were healed.

However, Jesus is also calling on us to believe in him. If we do this we are in one sense saved already. Jesus goes on to say that many people will not believe in him because they have chosen darkness instead of the light. From considering the lofty thought of God's love for us we are brought down to earth with a bump. The world in which we live is not all love. There is the darkness of evil. We as Christians are called to conquer evil in our own lives, in our society and in the world. We do this by love and living in the light of Christ.

PRAYER - ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

ST PATRICK 17TH MARCH - Nearly all we know of St Patrick (c.390-461?) comes from his authentic writings. He was British by birth, the son of a town councillor who was a deacon, while his grandfather was a priest. His place of birth was somewhere in the West between the mouth of the Severn and the Clyde. Whilst a youth he was captured by Irish pirates and reduced to slavery for six years, using this time to pray - in contrast to his earlier years in Britain when he 'knew not the true God'. He either escaped or was freed and returned to Britain. He was ordained and later made his way to Ireland C.435, working principally in the North, setting up his See at Armagh. From this base he made missionary journeys. Patrick's writings show a sincere simplicity and deep pastoral care, devoted to abolishing paganism, idolatry and sun worship.

JOSEPH - 19TH MARCH - Joseph was ST foster-father of Jesus and husband of Mary. He was of Davidic descent and his trade was probably that of carpenter. He was betrothed to Mary at the time of the Virgin Birth. His doubts about her conception of Jesus, the decisions to go to and return from Egypt were all the objects of angelic disclosures during sleep. He was declared Patron of the Universal Church by Pius IX in 1870.

CAFOD Walk for Water - This year CAFOD is focussing on providing water. They are focusing on Abdella who has to walk 10 miles each day to get water so he has little time for anything else. We are all invited to walk 10.000 steps each day in solidarity with him. What a good way to get our exercise or lose some of the weight the lockdown seems to have added. If you feel you couldn't manage that distance just get sponsorship for whatever you think you can manage. Michael Usher-Clark will be taking up this challenge. 10,000 steps a day for 40 days is 40,000 steps. Mike will actually be trying to get to half a million steps. Day 17 was a personal record for Mike with 20,334 steps. Total is now 286,317 steps and £375 raised already. Thank you for everybody who has given so far. We are hoping therefore that Nathan, who is already baptised, will receive the remaining Sacraments of Initiation around the feast of Pentecost. Please keep him in your prayers.

FIRST COMMUNION CANDIDATES 2020 - Reminder that there are some spaces at the Saturday 6pm Masses and all of Sunday 6pm Masses for those candidates from the 2020 programme wishing to make their FHC during these Masses in March. After March those 2020 candidates wishing to make their FHC can do so by arrangement with Canon Tom.

FIRST CONFESSIONS 2020 - As we have now started to receive applications for 2020 candidates to make their First Holy Communion during one of the three weekend Masses during March, we would like to remind the parents that were advised last October, that candidates can make their First Confession at any one of the four, weekly slots at OLOL, Corpus Christi, or prior arrangement with Canon Tom. FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH AT OLOL - To celebrate the Feast of St. Joseph on Friday 19th March, there will be a Mass at 7:30pm after the Stations of the Cross (at 7:00pm). If you wish to say a 9-day Novena which will commence from 10th to 18th March, novena booklets are available at both churches.

ST. JOSEPH - Pope Francis proclaimed a Year of St Joseph, to mark the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Pope Pius IX of St Joseph as the Patron of the Universal Church. SOLEMNITY OF ST JOSEPH, SPOUSE OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY - This year, for obvious reasons, it is unlikely that St Joseph's parishioners will be able to celebrate their Patronal Feast Day together. So to mark the Feast Day and Pope Francis' Year of St Joseph, Canon Tom has kindly agreed to bless statues of St Joseph at the morning Mass on Friday 19th March. They will then be welcomed into our homes and displayed in a prominent position. If you already have a statue which needs to be blessed, or would like to buy one (they are readily available online), bring it to Corpus Christi in good time for the 10.00 am Mass and place it in front of the altar. Don't forget to mark it with your name underneath.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION (CLASS OF 2020) AT OLOL - Candidates will be receiving their First Holy Communion on 14th & 21st March at the 9:15am Sunday Mass. We will be following the government guidelines regarding Covid-19 but be aware that Mass attendance will be higher on these dates. LEPRA APPEAL - Weekend of 20th/21st March -Over 7 million people are currently affected by leprosy across the world. Evidence shows over 3 million people are living with undiagnosed leprosy .Over 4 million people are living with a life-changing disability caused by leprosy. Although curable, many people are unable to access treatment, even though the cure is free. Lepra works to find, treat and rehabilitate these hidden people and promote their rights in India, Bangladesh, Mozambique and Zimbabwe. The lives of many people have been changed thanks to the generosity of supporters like you. In the 97 years since our founding we have helped millions of people affected by Neglected Tropical Diseases such as leprosy. Financial Report 2020

Thank you to everyone who supported the Parish financially last year. We are grateful to Parishioners who have Standing Orders, which has seen an increase in the past year; you do not need to Gift Aid to set up a Standing Order. Thank you to those Parishioners who have envelopes (both Gift Aid and Non-Gift Aid) and for using the envelopes during the lockdowns. Also, thank you to the Parishioners who have been using the 'Just Giving' scheme on-line.

The Parish Hall has been closed since last March and we have not been able to hold events, or let the hall, in the past year, resulting in a decrease in income. We have been given support by the Diocese with a reduction in our Parish Share over the past 12 months.

Thank you to everyone who donated to the various charities we supported last year, and the second collections which we were able to hold.

You may be wondering what is happening to the Presbytery. We have been unable to let it until a 'solution' had been found for the Parish Office. The 'Finance and Fabric Committee' looked at various options and it was felt that we should convert the garage and outer storeroom, and then erect a 'shed' to be used for storage. This has been approved by the Diocese and a Planning Application has recently been submitted to North Somerset Council. Once approved we will put the project to tender and hopefully start work later this year. We will then be able to let the Presbytery.
